

1.3. Qualification Structure

NOCN Level 2 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) for England

The NOCN Level 2 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) for England is a 46 credit qualification with a Total Qualification Time (TQT) of 460, including 318 - 394 Guided Learning Hours (GLH).

Learners must achieve a minimum of 46 credits. 24 credits must be taken from Mandatory Group A. A minimum of 22 credits must be taken from the learners chosen pathway.

MG Mandatory Group A - The learner must achieve 24 credits from the mandatory units in this group.
